<b>6 Points</b>	Use recycled materials (like boxes, paper, or bottles) to create a model of the Empire Windrush ship. Decorate it and write a few sentences about the people who travelled on it and their hopes for a new life. Bring it in to share with the class!	Look around your home and choose five objects that might have come from different countries. Find those countries on a map or globe, and draw lines to show how they connect to the UK. Create a little booklet with pictures or photos of the objects and write a sentence about where they came from or how they are used.	Plant a seed (e.g., a sunflower or cress) and keep a diary for a week. Draw pictures of the plant's growth each day and write a sentence or two about any changes they observe.
<b>5 Points</b>	Go on a nature walk or explore the garden. Find and draw three different plants, labelling the parts: roots, stem, leaves, and flower.	Write a letter as if you are a Windrush passenger arriving in Britain. What do they see, feel, and experience? Use descriptive language and emotive words.	Find five different leaves from your garden or a park. Create a leaf rubbing by placing paper over the leaf and colouring with crayons. Label each rubbing with where you found the leaf and what type of plant or tree it might have come from. Be a detective and discover as much as you can about the plants!
<b>4 Points</b>	Create a plant model using recycled materials (e.g., a cardboard stem, paper leaves, cotton wool roots). Label each part.	Research foods from the Caribbean. Draw a plate with their ideal Caribbean meal, labelling each food item.	Create a treasure map of an imaginary island. Include key features like mountains, rivers, and forests. Add a compass and label the cardinal directions.
<b>3 Points</b>	Talk to your parents or carers and find out about your family tree. Draw a picture of your family tree, including yourself and other family members. Can you find out where some of your family members were born? Add this information to your tree. Decorate your tree with leaves, flowers, or symbols that represent your family.	Imagine a plant superhero! What type of plant is it, and what special powers does it have? Draw your superhero and write a short story or comic strip showing how it uses its powers to save the day. You can even make a fact file about your superhero, explaining what makes it so amazing.	Choose a country from an atlas or globe. Write a postcard pretending they are visiting that country, describing what they see and do.
