# Take Away Homework!

**Choose your homework from the menu below. The peri-ometer shows you the level of challenge. You need to reach a minimum of ten points to achieve your homework target for this term!**



<b>6 Points</b>	Can you plan and make a Tudor feast? Include some of the ingredients you would need. Are there any surprises?	Create a board game about the Tudors. This game could be linked to any board game you like (for example you could make a Tudor monopoly or even a Tudor deck of cards).	<b>Get Creative!</b> Draw a self-portrait in the style of a Tudor artist. Use pencils, paints, crayons - whatever you have to hand!
<b>5 Points</b>	Using resources you have at home, create your own Tudor building. (cereal boxes etc)	Create a plan for getting Henry VIII in shape! Present your plan in any way you like. PowerPoint, poster, video of fitness regime. Create a photo, video or written diary/recount of your day and your learning.
<b>4 Points</b>	Make a mnemonic or song to recall the order of Henry VIII's wives. Make it interesting to sing or say.	Write a poem (minimum of 10 lines) describing what life was like in Tudor Britain.	Find out about some of the punishments given by the 'Torturing Tudors'. Create a poster showing several crimes (of different severities) and the punishment that would have been issued.
<b>3 Points</b>	Create a quiz with facts about the Tudors. Make sure you have the answers!	<u>PSHE link-</u> With a friend, create a piece of drama that demonstrates how to be assertive towards your friend without being rude. This can be performed in class or filmed and sent in.	Create a graph that shows how long each of Henry VIII's wives lived for.  What information can you get from your graph?
